# Case #01

### Initiator : Race Committee (Christophe Gaumont) Respondent : Bureau Vallée (Louis Burton)

### **Procedure Matter**

This hearing was held during the race in accordance with SI 12.4. Valid protest.

## Facts found

The race started at 18h00 TU.

At 21h00 TU, the RM received the tracks in a different format for all boats except Bureau Vallée.

10 minutes before this deadline, Bureau Vallée realized what time it was, she attempted a first sending via FTP, which failed. Then, she tried by email but the connection was inoperative.

Bureau Vallée sent at 21h02 to RM a picture of its Adrena software screen on a large scale by WhatsApp.

This picture does not provide the timing and GPS coordinates at the starting phase.

Bureau Vallée sent at 21h17 a CSV file containing information useful for track check.

Bureau Vallée sent at 21h37 a TRZ file allowing RM to easily check the track of the start.

All boats close to the starting line have been checked by RC and 4 boats but not Bureau Vallée, have been declared OCS.

## Conclusion

By not sending their track and/or logbook within 3 hours of the start, Bureau Vallée broke SI 7.2.2. In deciding the penalty, the jury used SI 11.2.2 and Appendix 6 of SIs to apply the Jury's power of discretion, noting that:

Bureau Vallée did not compromise safety, gain a competitive advantage or cause damage or injury. This breach is not listed in the penalties table, the Jury chose a time penalty of range 1 (0H-4H). The jury used the questions in Appendix 6 to justify a decrease in the penalty time.

## Decision

### A time penalty of 30 minutes is imposed on Bureau Vallée. This penalty shall be taken according to SI 11.5
